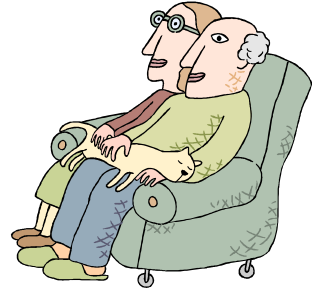

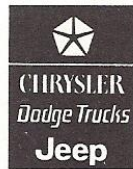

REMEMBERING DOUGLAS H. SEPHTON



Doug was the President of our RCNA - D.E.M.S. organization and passed away June 6, 2009. Don Woelfle and I had a plaque made up on behalf of Doug and we sent it to his wife Jean in Barrie. The plaque is solid granite, sits on a wrought iron stand and should last for many years. His wife Jean says it brought tears to her eyes and said that Doug would be proud to have this recognition.

D.E.M.S. was a division of the Royal Canadian Navy (Defensively Equipped Merchant Ships) during WW2 of which Don Woelfle and Sid Reinhart were part of.

During WW2 the German U-boats preyed on these ships as they were a direct pipeline in bringing food and supplies to various countries and were sinking them on a regular basis. My assignment as well as Don's was aboard these ships as Seaman Gunners, there were usually 2 to 8 Navy ratings on each ship.

Both Don Woelfle and Sid Reinhart sailed on these ships on the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. We stopped at many ports carrying supplies to New Zealand, India, etc.
