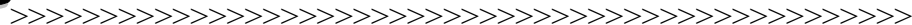

Hope you are having a great summer and stay healthy.

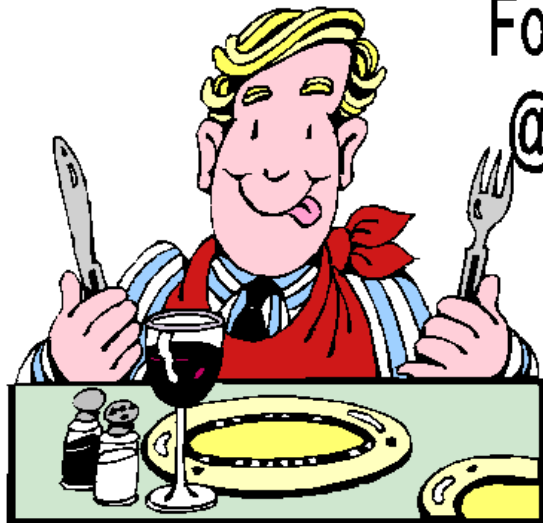
